Community members should be keeping their eyes open for the new *Career Building Skills Program (CBS)* that will be kicking off its first session this winter. The new CBS program is part of Tewa-tohnhí'saktha's Employment and Training division.

The CBS program is designed to motivate and prepare participants for future employment opportunities, both within and outside the community. During each session, scheduled to run for 18 weeks, participants will receive comprehensive training and development workshops that will offer exposure to various topics including but not limited to, personal awareness, interpersonal skills, computer training and

career development. Program participants will have the opportunity to visit surrounding academic institutions and training centers to discover future academic prospects.

In addition, each member will have the opportunity to gain on the job training by participating in short term internships in and around the community. This will allow participants the opportunity to utilize new skills and competencies gained in the CBS program.
